We loved being artists creating collages based on the work of the artist Frank Stella.



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








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We read the book Pumpkin Soup by

We made Igloos out of sugar cubes and looked at the amazing colours of the Northern Lights. We used chalk pastels to create the different colours of the lights.










Visit from the chicks

World Book Day was lots of fun. We enjoyed dressing up as our favourite book characters and creating work based on our book: Bob Man on the Moon by Simon Bartram





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
We followed the clues to find out the alien species that had crashed landed.


We became detectives and crash investigators when we found an alien spaceship had crash landed on our school field!
