You can apply online from Monday 2 October 2023. The deadline for applications to be received by the local authority is Monday 15 January 2024.

If your application is received after the closing date, your chance of securing a place at one of your preference schools could be seriously affected.

### Harvest Festival 702 Meals Provided by You - Thank You!

Dear Thorney Island School,

On behalf of Chichester District Foodbank, I would like to thank you, your staff and pupils for your generous Harvest Festival donation of food to help sustain the work of Chichester District foodbank to feed those who are in crisis.

This year we have seen a steady increase in the number of people who need our help. Feeding approximately 7015 people across the district, that's more than during the pandemic!

In addition to the emergency food parcels we supply holiday lunch packs for school children who are eligible for free school meals during term time. This Christmas we will be distributing about 1000 packs to support children over the holidays to ensure they have the option of a hot meal each day.

All of our work relies solely on donations from the community and we really value your continued support.

For your interest, the Harvest donation weighed 175.4 kg, which is the equivalent to providing 702 meals.

Thank you again for your donations which are very much appreciated.

# Thank You for Your Support with Home Learning

It is always a last resort to have to close the school, however, as many of you are aware the Main Entry Point (MEP), the only vehicle access point to camp, had to be closed by the Station Commander due to the flooding becoming so severe that there was risk to life. (At its highest the water reached 50cm at the centre of the road). However, with the support of the military we were able to reopen the school, with over 70 children and 24 staff being transported onto the Island and then back again at the end of the day. The support of the military was exceptional and above and beyond all support I received from any other agency. I have passed on your thanks to all those involved for going above and beyond expectations to ensure the children had the education they deserve. Our community certainly came to the rescue!

The One Church also allowed us to use their car park and were fully supportive of our efforts to open the school, along with Councillor Andrew Kerry-Bedell who was in constant contact to offer his support. Without this support we would have had to remain closed for much longer.
