Applying for Free School Meals

Is your household income below £16,190 per year and/or are you in receipt of Universal Credit (with no element of Working Tax Credit)? If the answer is yes, your child(ren) may be entitled to receive Free School Meals?

Registering for FSM could also raise an extra £1,455 for our school.

This applies to <u>all</u> children, including children in Years R – 2 who automatically receive Universal Infant Free School Meals.

Administation of Non-prescribed Medication ie Paracetamol/Calpol

As stated in the Administration of Medicines Policy, the school holds a small amount of paracetamol/Calpol for administing to children who develop symptoms eg: headache, temperature, earache, during the school day.

Only under <u>exceptional circumstances</u> where it is deemed that their administration is required to allow the child to remain in school, will the school administer a single dose of paracetamol/Calpol.

The school will not administer paracetamol/Calpol:

- as a preventative, i.e. in case the child develops symptoms during the school day
- · if parents have not administered medication that is required before school
