I am pleased to inform parents that a bid to the Armed Forces Families Fund has been successful and as a result the school will be able to continue to provide individual support for children with delayed speech and language, train staff to deliver additional emotional support to vulnerable pupils and continue to employ a 'Drawing and Talking' Practitioner.

Along with this, the funding will allow the school to provide additional enrichment opportunities and to ensure the needs of children struggling with behaviour access the appropriate support in school. This funding will also provide additional time for staff to ensure military families are supported in completing any relevant paperwork so they can access the support they need.

This is a significant boost to the schools funding and will mean we will be able to maintain and enhance the support we are able to provide to the children at our school.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank The Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust for their continued support of the children at our school.
