

Welcome to Eagle Class

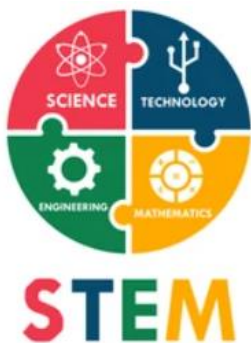
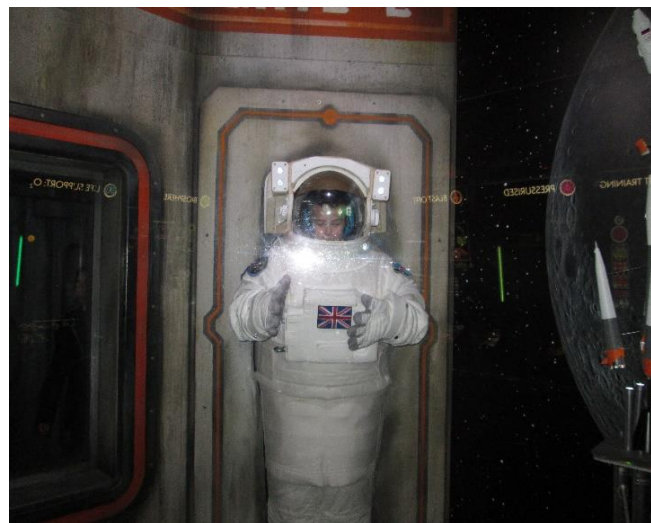


We have had a fun-filled and action-packed year in Eagle Class! Here are some examples of our learning!
