Maths

This half term we will be looking at:

- Calculating the perimeter and area of rectangles and compound shapes made up of different rectangles, including beginning to use formulas for this
- Line graphs, tables and timetables
- Understanding angles - how to calculate them, draw them and identifying them within shapes
- Formal written methods for division

How can you help?

Asking the children to practise telling the time on analogue and digital clocks and getting them to look at and understand timetables. It is vital that the children continue to practise and keep their recall of times tables sharp. This is so vital for every aspect of mathematics and poor times tables knowledge is one of the main reasons why children struggle with some areas of the subject. **Please ensure that children continue to keep these skills sharp by playing on Times Tables Rock Stars as much as possible.**

English

This half term we are going to first be looking at poetry. Poetry is used much more often than we may realise, including in songs and raps. We will then be looking at the amazing book *The Nowhere Emporium*. This uses fantastic descriptive language which we will be looking to use and magpie for our own writing. Please discuss with your children any good uses of language that you or they see when they are reading, as the more they read, the better writers they will become.

PE

We are doing athletics this half term, alongside continuing to develop our fundamental movement skills. Due to Bank Holidays and the weather, our PE days may change so it is vital that your child has their **full PE kit (white top, black shorts and trainers) in school every day**. Now we are getting towards the summer, and the children are getting older, it is not acceptable for them to be doing PE and getting sweaty in their school clothes so please remind your child to always have their PE kit with them.
