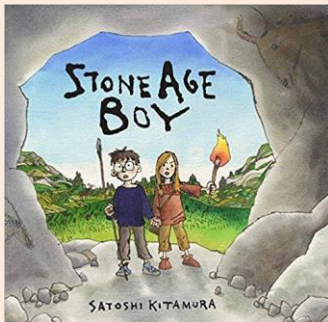


Summer Term 1 2026

This half term, we will be learning all about the lives of people who lived in Stone Age Britain! Below is an outline of our learning in a range of key subjects. I hope you find it useful when supporting your child with their learning.

English

Our key text in English this half term is 'Stone Age Boy' by Satoshi Kitamura. This story will be the inspiration for writing recounts, diary entries and poetry.



Maths



We have a busy half term in Maths, looking at:

- Comparing, ordering, adding and subtracting fractions.
- Counting money, finding change and solving problems with money

You can help at home by supporting your child in using money, making change and finding amounts left after buying something.

Science

In Science, we are going to explore different types of rock and understand how fossils are formed.

History and Geography

In History, we will take on a variety of enquiries and examine different sources of evidence to find out about the daily life of people in Stone Age Britain, in particular their homes, diet and tools. In our Geography lessons, we will be finding out about early settlements in Britain, including the locations and reasons people chose to settle there.
