Maths

This half term we will be looking at:

- Using our knowledge of co-ordinates to reflect and translate points and shapes
- Adding and subtracting decimal numbers
- Multiplying and dividing decimal numbers by 10, 100 and 1,000
- Using our knowledge of decimal numbers to convert between different units of measurement e.g. converting millilitres to litres and kilometres to metres. We will also look at converting between metric and imperial units of measurement.

How can you help?

It is vital that your child's time tables skills are kept sharp, for everything that we will be doing this half term but also so that they are in the best possible position moving into year 6. Poor times tables knowledge is one of the main reasons why children struggle with some areas of the subject.

Please ensure that children continue to practise the times tables as much as possible for example by playing on Times Tables Rock Stars.

English

This half term we will continue to use the book *The Nowhere Emporium* as ideas for our writing. We started looking at this book last half term and we will now be stepping through the doors of the Emporium to find the Wonders that are hidden there. We will be thinking about how to use emotive language to add tension and suspense in our stories. We will continue learning about how effective description can hook the reader in, and we will be recapping the use of dialogue in stories and thinking about the effect it has on the audience.

How can you help?

Take time to discuss effective uses of description and the creation of suspense that you come across in stories with your children. Remember it is never too late to make a start on getting your reading certificates and building good habits that will be beneficial next year.

PE

As the days warm up, we will want to be outside doing PE as much as possible so this may mean that the days we do PE may change. Now it is warmer, it is even more vital that the children change for PE and remember to **have their full PE kit in school every single day (white top, black shorts and trainers).**

Science

Our work in science this term will focus on forces: how they are used in fairground rides; how they affect the way objects move; how we can make heavier loads easier to lift and move. There are some great fun videos available on the BBC Bitesize website:
