English

Our learning will be focussed on the book: Toby and the Great Fire of London in which we will be exploring and having a go at diary writing, imagining we were there in 1666. A reading of Toby and the Great Fire of London, can be found on YouTube at:

You could help your child at home by:

Encouraging them to keep a diary about what they have done over the week or to write an imaginary diary e.g., the diary of a superhero or spy.

Discussing the layout and words used in a diary.

Finding out information about the Great Fire of London online or from a book and creating a fact file.

Reading and discussing the book Toby and The Great Fire of London (youtube link above).

Maths

Some of the things that we will be exploring include:

- Place-value
- Number bonds to 10, 20 and 100 and counting in multiples of 2, 5 and 10.

You could help your child at home by:

Practice adding when playing board games, dice games or out shopping.

Talking to them about the place-value of numbers. For example, 'how many 10s in 15? How many 1s?' especially when using money.

Practice counting games forwards and backwards in different steps.

Logging onto your child's 'Numbots' account with them and practicing different maths skills. (Logins will go home with your child)

In DT we will be investigating bread and making our own, just like they did in the bakery at Pudding Lane at the time of the Great Fire of London! You could try making your own buns at home and write some instructions for how to make them.

P.E.

We have PE on ***Mondays and Tuesdays***. Please ensure your child has their PE kit in school on those days.

Art

We will be making collages of the Great Fire of London in the style of Frank Stella. You could look at his art at home and practice collaging.

History
